Concept Note

The idea of gender is highly debated, and has been deprived of its biological connections in recent years, and is stated as a purely social construct. Performance theory too ascertains sexuality, one's sexual identity, or gender to be a performance that is socially and culturally constructed. This result of transplanting gender, and by that sex, from the landscape of biology onto a social sphere was achieved initially by feminists and social theorists. Questions as to the distinctions between sex and gender hence arise, prolonging the debate. Suppose the belief that sex determines gender is already thwarted; it is further being disregarded by the very presence of intersex and transgender people whose gender experience is different from their biological sex. Hence, in such cases where the birth sexes are ambiguous or irrelevant to individuals, they are addressed as people according to their gender experience in legal documents; here, gender determines sex, completely debunking the notion of sex being a fixed category. This is a visible example to prove that gender and sexuality are fluid, should be studied as a continuum, and cannot be limited within binaries to be categorized. This could have been a major reason for the scientists and biologists who could not think beyond the compartmentalized binary of sex or gender to term the people who did not fit their definition as 'Queer', 'othering' them ever since modern science began. The queering of sexuality has meant that studies are now tracing the ways in which bisexual, transgender, intersex, gay, (LGBTIQA2S+) bodies experience and live their gender beyond normative binaries. This conference would attempt to encapsulate the inherent multiple perspectives of the theme by incorporating the pragmatic dimensions of Gender theoretical and Furthermore, it envisages a dynamic academic interaction where the critical and historical paradigms of the gender-culture association can be perceptually evaluated.
